Easter landed in March this year. So, what am I supposed to write about for April? Oh wait... Easter Day begins a whole season of the church year! Good, I'll write about Easter.

Somebody said to me, "Easter is the most important holiday of the year." Yes! Without a doubt, Easter is very important for Christians. But, just as important is to know why Easter matters. Why do Christians rejoice in the resurrection of Christ? What would you say to someone who asks you why Easter matters?

I will give you two reasons.

First, the resurrection vindicates Jesus. It proves that Jesus is the Son of God (Rom. 1:4), Lord and Christ (Acts 2:36), and it demonstrated that all authority in heaven and earth has been given to him (Matt. 28:18).

Second, it means the resurrection of the dead has begun. Unfortunately, I think this fails to resonate with a lot of Christians, due not least to how we understand "heaven." In the Bible, [the kingdom of] heaven is not a location but a relational activity, that is, "heaven" is wherever Jesus is, and to be in heaven is to be under the reign and rule of the King. But, for many, "heaven" is merely "where we go when we die." If we talk such that the goal of salvation is for us to "go to heaven," then Easter will have lost its meaning. We must remember that this "heaven" is an intermediate state between *death* and the *resurrection of the dead*.

Death is the end of life, and our culture's attempts to ignore and deny death and its misery likely provide the reason for this misconception. For instance, instead of having "funerals," we try to flower it up by calling them "celebrations of life," ignoring the evil and focusing only on what makes us feel better, trying to find the good in the bad. Or, when loved ones die, we lie to ourselves and others by claiming that our loved one "got his wings" or "is freed from this body." For people who think like this, Easter as the resurrection from the dead will not make sense and cannot give hope.

What do we mean when we say, "Christ is risen!"? It means that death, our evil enemy, has been overturned, overcome, conquered in Jesus Christ. Baptized into him, we too will rise and conquer this evil effect of sin. In the face of darkness, we have confidence to sing:


Scatter the darkness, break the gloom; Sun, reveal an empty tomb Shining with joy for all our sorrows, Hope and peace for all tomorrows, Life uneclipsed by doubt and dread: Christ has risen from the dead!

Banners of triumph, be unfurled! Trumpets, sound throughout the world! Crying and sighs, give way to singing: Life from death, our Lord is bringing! Let there begin the jubilee—Christ has gained the victory! (LSB 481)

RUN, PASTOR, RUN!

SERVANT TRIP FUND RAISER May 4, 2024



Pastor Ziemann is putting his running legs to work again this year. He will be attempting to run/walk part of a 24-hour race in the Kirtland area at Chapin Forest Park. The racecourse is a one-mile loop in the park on the ski lodge side. Pastor Ziemann will

run the course in two parts – one in the morning/early afternoon and then at night after church. His goal is 100K (62 miles).

The fundraising aspect of this event is for youth and congregation members to find people who will pledge Pastor per kilometer or mile. For example, if someone pledged a dollar a mile, and Pastor Ziemann ran 100 Kilometers, that would be a \$100 donation. The more pledges and distance – the higher the success of the fundraiser. Invite local businesses, workplaces, and other places outside the church to sponsor. This unique event should create interest.

The youth will use the money for their servant trip to Camp Pioneer in July and for future trips in the years to come.

Distance conversions – 50K = 31 miles, 80K+ = 50 miles, 100K = 62 miles

Any medications should be given to your Pastor/adult chaperon with a note attached detailing how and when the medicine should be taken. This includes common pain and cold medicine or tablets. Our Sunday service will be at camp again this year. Zion youth - We will return to Zion by 11:30 a.m. on Sunday. Registration is limited to the first 40. Beyond this, you will be placed on a waiting list to see if other cabins are available. This is very important.

LWML MISSION OF THE MONTH

Equipping Young Leaders LCMS Youth Ministry — \$50,000

LCMS Youth Ministry faithfully leads, serves, provides resources, and networks with youth and adults working through LCMS districts and congregations — with Christ and His gifts at the heart and center of everything. The sponsored YouthLead program and Servant Events are designed to train young leaders and give them opportunities for service. One of the unique features of YouthLead is that the training is led by the Executive Team made up of young people elected by their peers. In this picture you see Executive Team member Ally leading her small group during training.



The March 2022 annual YouthLead training was one of the largest in forty years with more than 90 participants. The number of attendees identified the need to produce additional opportunities and resources to support more youth and youth ministries.



Offering YouthLead conferences regionally, piloting a new format of Servant Events to include leadership training, and increasing curriculums will offer service and leadership training to more teens and young adults. LCMS Youth Ministries wants to deepen their understanding of the needs of young people and the best practices for youth and young adult ministry. Survey results show the way to keep young people connected to the church is to give them chances to serve and lead. This grant will allow LCMS Youth Ministry to expand their current programs to equip young leaders.

THE LWML OHIO DISTRICT CONVENTION is being held at the Holiday Inn, Canton on June 21-22, 2024. The theme for this convention is based on Psalm 28:7a, **THE LORD IS MY STRENGTH AND MY SHIELD**. Information sheets and Registration forms will be posted and available on the Mission bulletin board.

Greetings from an ever-grateful Operational Christmas Child Shoebox enthusiast. And boy, do we have a lot to be grateful and enthusiastic about. In 2023 there were 11.3 million shoeboxes shipped from 11 countries, and 5.1 million children enrolled in The Greatest Journey. While it is fun to shop and make things to fill our Shoeboxes our biggest gift in the Shoebox is prayers for the children to come to a relationship with Jesus Christ. Good News from Samaritan's Purse! "On average of every 60 seconds, FIVE children accept Jesus Christ through receiving an Operation Christmas Child Shoebox!"

Thank you to members of Team Zion who have been active at home this winter with sewing, knitting, beading, and crocheting projects. Some of these are being done by our shut-ins and even members in nursing homes. If you would like a pattern or supplies, let me know & I can hook you up from the donations that our congregation has been bringing to us.

It is now time for our first **Make It - To Pack It** workshop on Wednesday, April 10 at 6:00pm in the church basement. Please bring any of your finished projects for a quick show & tell before we make instruments, toys, bracelets, and games to pack. Each of these crafts are child friendly and will be fun to do with your son, daughter, or grandchild (7-ish years or older). Also, bring your own labeled scissors, glue gun and wire cutters.

For the workshop we need 2" Styrofoam balls, pony beads with large holes, plastic easter eggs, yarn, pipe-cleaners, wiggle eyes, jingle bells, marbles, poker chips, tiny shaped erasers, glass landscape beads, circle garage-sale stickers, felt, unwired ribbon especially 1/4" - 1/2" grosgrain,

empty cereal boxes, and self-sticking foamy shapes. Thank you in advance if you clean out your craft area for these projects.

In April we are asking for donations for the hygiene/health care kits. We pack toothbrushes in 2-piece cases, chap stick, combs/brushes, sunglasses, tissues, band-aids, washcloths, nail clippers, emery boards, and tweezers.

Remember, no liquids, glass that can spill or break, or even toothpaste that tastes sweet and can be mistaken for food.

These kits are packed at our Friday work sessions into bags that our seamstresses have been making this winter. Our sessions are in Zion's basement on Fridays from 10:00 – noon. We would love to have you join us any week.


