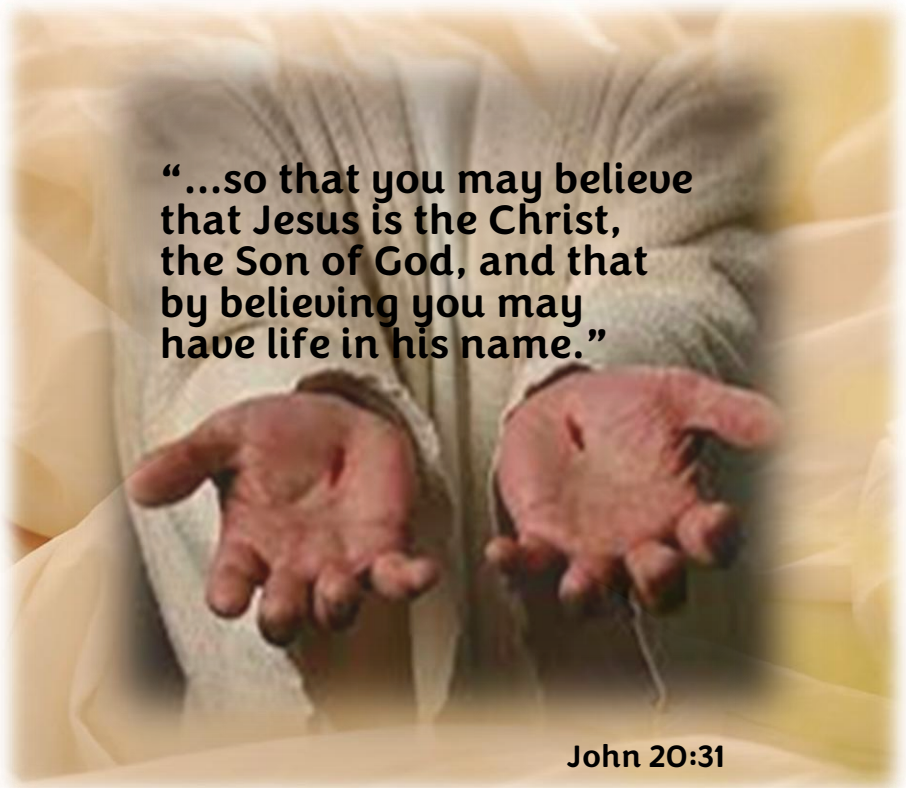

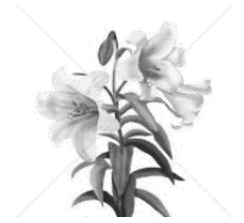

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Zion and Our Shepherd,

A happy and blessed Easter season to you. I was told that it has been six months since I left, but it feels much longer. I miss you, but I am grateful that you find ways to keep in touch. Thank you for your text messages, calls, cards, mailings, and your prayers most especially.


We pray, “Thy kingdom come.” In the Large Catechism, Luther explains that this is nothing more than to say, “Dear Father, we ask you first to give us your Word, so that the gospel may be properly preached throughout the world and then that it may be received in faith and may work and dwell in us, so that your kingdom may pervade among us through the Word and the power of the Holy Spirit and the devil’s kingdom may be destroyed so that he may have no right or power over us until finally his kingdom is utterly eradicated and sin, death, and hell wiped out, that we may live forever in perfect righteousness and blessedness.”

In our pluralistic culture, especially my context in the military, I feel and recognize the weight of this war between the kingdom of God and the kingdom of Satan a little bit more than I have before. I cannot begin to express how thankful I am for the Church’s prayers, bending God’s ear and imploring him to keep pastors and missionaries faithful to his truth. If it were not for the promise of God’s presence and his people, I would be utterly lost. I wish to tell you that you have wonderful brothers and sisters in Christ out here in Wyoming. They have graciously welcomed me into their lives, and I can’t wait for you to meet them one day.

In my short time as chaplain, many wonderful conversations have happened. We should not underestimate how valuable is our Lutheran theology. It has brought clarity and comfort to a handful of people here, even in my short time. Then again, why should I be surprised? It’s the good news of Jesus.

Christ is risen! So shall we.
